AETC commander: Keesler will be back

A visit from the commander of Air Education and Training Commander brought encouraging words to Keesler Air Force Base personnel.

General William Looney, along with Chief Master Sgt. Rodney Ellison, AETC command chief master sergeant, and their spouses, spent Thursday touring the base in a helicopter and visiting with the troops.

"Katrina has affected all of us," General Looney said. "We came here because we wanted to see for ourselves. Chief Ellision and myself also brought each of our wives because we wanted them to talk to your wives. It pains me to see my people suffer."

General Looney sensed spirits were up as he called here in the aftermath of the storm.

"From my first phone call with [Brig. Gen. William Lord, 81st Training Wing commander], I had a sense that Keesler and its people would survive," General Looney said. "This very well could be the greatest natural disaster in the history of the U.S., but I have no doubt that we will come back from this."

General Looney added that support is pouring in from across the country.

"Every part of the country is standing up with you," he said. "We have challenges that lie ahead, but we will turn loose the resources of the Air Force to get Keesler and its families back on their feet."

General Looney said right now the biggest concern is getting the job done as safely as possible.

"We are not going to violate any laws, but we'll worry about paperwork later," he said. "We need to get things done. We need basic allowance for housing to be started; we need access to money; we need to ask what the Air Force Aid Society can do.

"AETC's priority right now is Keesler Air Force Base and those personnel's family members," General Looney said. "One of ours is in need. And families always help each other out."
